

#### by the Chief Executive

This is my last Annual Report to members because after nearly 11 years, I have decided to retire to more leisurely pursuits. My last event will be the Royal Three Counties Show in June 2023.

I'm very pleased and relieved to leave knowing that after two devastating seasons for our Society and industry caused by Covid, all our shows returned to full strength in 2022. Covid didn't just prevent the running of shows, it had many other side effects throughout our Society, most significantly an impact on staff. Despite financial support from the Government, we were only able to stage a few events, with restricted attendances. Consequently, several staff became restless and nervous about our future and decided to explore new career opportunities. This resulted in the loss of considerable expertise and created an additional challenge for us.

With the impact of Covid diminishing, we got the green light in 2022 to run our shows as in the past, but this time with almost a completely new team of Shows and Marketing staff. That said, the new quality recruits blended well with the remaining talented team members and faced the challenge head on. The outcome was exceptional, delivering wonderful shows and hitting all targets. To complement this further, our Venue Hire team delivered one of the best years on record for third party events staged at the showground. Long may this continue.

A wonderful highlight this year was the attendance of our Patron, HRH The Princess Royal, at the RHS Malvern Spring Festival in May. Many visitors, traders and volunteers enjoyed meeting Her Royal Highness, and we really are blessed to have such a supportive Patron.

In September, we began the process of recruiting my successor, casting the net far and wide, and by the end of our financial year we were delighted to appoint David Prescott, an outstanding leader with considerable Chief Executive experience of leading a large complex organisation in the retail sector. Personally, this is my perfect scenario, as I can leave confident in the knowledge that David will take us to the next level and beyond.

I have immensely enjoyed my time at Three Counties, working with and meeting so many wonderful people. I would like to thank all staff and key contractors for their outstanding commitment and particularly my Board of Trustees and Council for their support and dedication as invaluable volunteers. In the future, I'm looking forward to attending Three Counties' events as a visitor and to simply enjoy the day.

### Introduction to our New President

The Rt. Revd. Rachel Treweek, Bishop of Gloucester & President 2023

Bishop Rachel was previously elected as President of Three Counties Agricultural Society for 2020. Unfortunately, the unprecedented pandemic meant that Bishop Rachel was unable to fulfil the role and we are delighted that she has agreed to return as President in 2023.

Bishop Rachel was brought up in Hertfordshire and was educated at Broxbourne School. She trained as a Speech and Language Therapist at Reading University where she gained a BA in Linguistics and Language Pathology. She worked as a Paediatric Speech and Language Therapist within the NHS and served on the Child Development Team at the Royal Free Hospital before becoming the Clinical Manager for Paediatric Speech and Language Therapists in Health Centres across three north London health authorities.

The Right Revd Rachel Treweek began her life in ordained ministry in 1994, after training at Wycliffe Hall in Oxford. She served her title at St George & All Saints, Tufnell Park before becoming Vicar of St James the Less, Bethnal Green in 1999. During her time in Bethnal Green she also served as CME Officer and Bishop's Visitor in the Stepney Area. She was appointed as Archdeacon of Northolt in 2006, serving in that role for five years, before becoming Archdeacon of Hackney in July 2011.

#### Bishop Rachel has made history with a number of firsts:

She became the first female diocesan Bishop in the Church of England and became the first female Bishop in the House of Lords.

She was consecrated as the 41st Bishop of Gloucester at Canterbury Cathedral in July 2015 and formally began her new role in September 2015. She entered the House of Lords in October 2015.



## Funtastic & COUNTRYTASTIC

Our first face-to-face show of the season was a fun-filled family event which gave our visitors the opportunity to learn all about farming, food and the countryside.

Visitors enjoyed expanding their knowledge with Ask the Farmer and discovered an array of facts about their favourite farmyard animals that joined us once again this year. Not only were there sheep, goats, pigs, cattle and horses, but an array of familiar pets such as rabbits and guinea pigs. There were hands-on cookery sessions where visitors learned about where their food comes from, which included bread making, baking pasties with the Ladies in Pigs and visitors could even practice milking Daisy, the Cow.

Opportunities to be creative included making clay figures with Eastnor Pottery, outdoor activities included bushcraft skills, den building and nature play and there were a host of chances to take part in a sporting activity.

Visitors cheered as they watched their favourite teams take part in the fast and furious mounted games, witnessed expertly trained gundogs demonstrate their skills, watched young handlers confidently showing their pigs and were educated during the highly entertaining Sheep Show. Additionally, we hope that some of our young visitors were inspired to take up a future career in farming or animal care with the engaging and interactive activities provided by the Royal Agricultural University and Hartpury University and College.





## **RHS MALVERN** SPRING FESTIVAL

This year's RHS Malvern Spring Festival returned a roaring success. beautiful gardens, brim-full of spectacular horticulture, artisan food & drink, family-friendly activities and fascinating talks.

This May, along with amazing weather, we welcomed more than 100,000 gardeners to enjoy the Festival packed with inspiring new features, incredible floral displays and show and feature gardens alongside a lively line up of floral. gardening and food experts. Jo Whiley, Monty Don, Carol Klein, Raymond Blanc, Frances Tophill, and Jonathan Moseley were just a few names who all shared their expertise and passion for gardening, growing and cooking. This year's RHS Malvern Spring Festival Three Counties Agricultural Society Patron, HRH The Princess Royal. This Festival set out as a celebration of not just the Platinum Jubilee, but the occasion as a whole.

Each year, RHS Malvern Spring Festival reaches out to nurture new horticultural talent and 2022 saw a fresh group of creative designers. This Crowley-Wroe won Best Show Garden, with visitors crowning The Cancer Tatlow their winner of the People's Choice Award.

Between the six judged show gardens, there were three RHS Silver-Gilt, one Silver and two Bronze medal awards.

New for 2022, the Vitamin G Garden was the first RHS feature garden at Malvern. The Vitamin G Garden was inspired by evidence-based research that was published in April 2021 by RHS scientists Professor Alistair Griffiths and Dr Lauriane Chalman-Pui proving how gardening benefits our mental, physical and social wellbeing.

This year's floral marquee was full of talent with over 50 specialist nurseries exhibiting. An impressive haul of medals were awarded including 27 Golds, 15 Silver Gilt. 13 Silver and one Bronze.

This year saw a successful return of the Show after three years off due to Covid, with a new Shows team. Pre-event ticket sales were up on previous years and visitor numbers were ahead of target.

The Show returned on a triumphant note, with crowds filling the showground to take in all the action across the livestock and equine judging rings as well as the main ring attractions, which included demonstrations of agricultural machinery, the much-loved daily grand parade of livestock as well as exciting motorcycle stunts and the daring parachute descent from the Red Devils.

The heritage of this prestigious event shone through brightly as we celebrated 100 years of the three counties of Herefordshire, Worcestershire and Gloucestershire coming together to form the Show that we know and love today.

97,000 visitors attended the Show which celebrated every aspect of rural life with many new features including the Food & Drink Festival, the STIHL TIMBERSPORTS® British Championships, the Three Counties Hub, the AgriTech Theatre and the new Family Trail guiding visitors around the Show.

On Friday, 3,000 school children attended free of charge and took part in a range of educational workshops from sausage making to learning about the water cycle. Over the weekend, almost 800 scouts and guides worked towards achieving their 'Three Counties Badge'.

The AgriTech Zone had a full line up of speakers throughout the weekend, the Food and Drink Theatre was well attended with samples and tasters of food and drink from across the three counties and our special guests Kaleb Cooper and Show Ambassador Adam Henson were welcomed across the showground, giving interviews and getting involved in the many demonstrations and talks around the Show.

In the livestock judging rings, high quality entries filled all three days of the Show, with expert and dedicated stockmen and stockwomen from all over the country travelling to exhibit some of the finest livestock in the UK. Sunday's Rare and Minority Breeds Show commenced at 8am with showing continuing throughout the day.

The UK's largest Harvest Festival returned this year with a repeat of the new three day format, wowing the attendees with an array of animals, giant vegetables and harvest produce.

The Show proved as popular as ever with a footfall of 64,000.

The Harvest Pavilion was a wonderful spectacle with over 1,500 entries of flowers, plants and garden produce, while in the CANNA UK National Giant Vegetables Championship, a record number of Guinness World Records were broken. The staggering 11 new world records included Longest Turnip, measuring an astounding 4.605mm, Longest Leek, Heaviest Aubergine, and the Heaviest Field Pumpkin weighing in at an astonishing 121.6Kg.

The Gin Show made a welcome return this year, sponsored by Ludlow Gin, and was a hit with visitors with visitors and exhibitors alike. The Best Tradestand was awarded to Piston Gin, while Hay Distillery won the People's Choice Award with their Dr Beaky's Gin.

The open-air Food and Drink Village came back, with many stands selling out during the day. The Kitchen Theatre hosted by Mark Diacono, featured well known chefs; John Torrode and Bake-Off star Chigs Parmar, alongside local chefs from Green Cow Kitchen and The Riverside Inn.

The RHS Flower Show and Bulb Market were bursting with a bumper crop of nurseries this year, as gardeners took advantage of the selection on offer. An impressive 19 Gold Medals were awarded for displays in the Floral Marquee.

Nicki Chapman hosted a line-up of special guests in the Garden Theatre, including Adam Frost, Arit Anderson and Frances Tophill, who all provided expert gardening tips, together with stunning floral demonstrations from Jonathan Moseley.

Animals are a firm favourite at the Malvern Autumn Show, and the newly expanded World of Animals area was a real hit with visitors. The new World of Animals Arena was filled with exciting entertainment from jousting and carriage driving to heavy horses and parades of animals. The captivating exotic animals were a must see as well as delightful displays of giant tortoises, rabbits, cavies, sheep, goats, pigs, dogs and horses.

#### **LEARNING AT THE THREE COUNTIES**

Education remained a key focus of the Society's activities in 2022. The year began with a virtual Careers Fair in January, and our shows made a hugely successful return by offering children and young people who took part a diverse range of engaging and educational opportunities. CountryTastic, held in April offered children experiential learning activities around the theme of 'Farmyard Friends'.

At the RHS Malvern Spring Festival, the School Garden Challenge was an enormously popular element of the Show. The five schools and colleges that took part produced incredible gardens to an extremely high standard and the children and young people were offered excellent developmental opportunities. This year's theme celebrated Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee and it was made even more special when the children presented their gardens with such enthusiasm and pride to HRH The Princess Royal. The Discovery Dome was a fantastic addition to the Festival Green and hosting the Natural History Museum was a highlight to many of our young visitors.

The Royal Three Counties Show continued to offer schools free tickets and we welcomed almost 3,000 children and young people on the first day of the show. Additionally, nearly 800 Scouts and Guides members joined us to earn their bespoke badge.

The Malvern Autumn Show offered children and young people the chance to showcase their creativity in the Discover Harvest area and young visitors learned a variety of skills during numerous practical workshops.

### **AGRICULTURAL BURSARIES**

The Three Counties Agricultural Society Bursary, in memory of the late Joe Henson MBE is a bursary established to support and encourage students enrolling in further education courses related to agricultural studies. This year, we were delighted to support an additional three students. bringing our current total to eight. We are immensely proud to have bursary awardees studying at all the major land-based universities and colleges in and around our region.

Also, we were delighted that HRH The Princess Royal launched the John Tedstone Bursary at the RHS Malvern Spring Festival and we are looking forward to receiving applications and awarding bursaries in memory of the late John Tedstone in 2023. John was a renowned Orchardist and Farmer from Kingsland, Leominster and his lifelong work was in the orchards of his home at New House Farm which he bequeathed to the Three Counties Agricultural Society. The proceeds from the sale of New House Farm will be delivered in accordance with John's Will and will provide bursaries for agricultural and horticultural studies.


